

Royal Worcester thimble painters

I have always had a love for handpainted Royal Worcester thimbles.

My best thimble find is an unmarked 19th century handpainted bird, with the lovely translucent porcelain of early Worcester in the taller, narrow shape of their early thimbles. This was found here in Brisbane. It was sold to me as milk or opaline glass, a term I had never heard before.

It is a term used for translucent porcelain of 19th century Royal Worcester.

Another term associated with early Royal Worcester porcelain, is blush, peach bloom or a biscuit finish, describing the warm creamy ground of the porcelain. According to Henry Sandon, Royal Worcester thimbles made between 1860 and 1939 are of a glazed parian body which has a creamier, smoother body than bone china, which is very white and translucent.



Then there is the handpainted Kookaburra (1926) that Edwin Holmes first described in May 1994. This is the only type of Royal Worcester thimble that I have encountered with a self-patterning of indentations on both sides. Holmes could not explain this. I have now seen other examples of RW thimbles with this type of marking.

Dating your Royal Worcester Thimbles

The early blush, biscuit or translucent thimbles of the late 19th century have no signatures or marks.

Up to the 1880s, later painters from then into the twentieth century could not surpass the earlier finest painting.

Royal Worcester thimbles with a **puce** or purple backstamp date from late nineteenth century into early 20th century and thimbles are usually signed by the painters.

Dating of these thimbles can be calculated from 1891 by a series of dots and/or symbols. The table can be found in The Thimble Society of London, winter 1997 catalogue, p5 (some images reproduced below)

Royal Worcester produced hand-painted thimbles until 1986.

Those Royal Worcester thimbles in production after 1986 are decal thimbles.

Royal Worcester Porcelain Backstamps (1862 - 1963)

Reproduced from Thimble Society of London, winter 1997, p5.



L>R: 1862 - 1876 - 1892 - 1916 - 1928 - 1956

Between 1862 and 1867 specific indications of the year of manufacture are rare but may sometime be found in the form of the last two figures of the date, e.g. 64 for 1864, printed below the standard mark.

From 1867 a letter system was used to indicate the year of manufacture. From 1876 the crown sits down onto the circle.

continued until 1963 when 13 dots are arranged around the standard mark. After 1956 the letter W was nearly always substituted with a letter R in a circle, i.e. 1960 = R or W under the circle with 10 dots.

The Royal Worcester Porcelain Co., Ltd. was formed as a Joint Stock Company in 1862 and since that time pieces have been marked with some type of date code.

The standard backstamp from 1862 onwards, illustrated here, includes the number 51 in the centre which refers to the year 1751 when the Worcester Porcelain Company was founded by Dr. John Wall. In ignorance, this number is often mistaken for the date of manufacture of a particular thimble.

It is difficult to find information on thimbles produced by Royal Worcester. There is a list of Royal Worcester painters in Von Hoelle's *Encyclopedia of thimbles*, but it is incomplete. Hopefully, this listing will go somewhat to remedy this.

The Sandon listing of RW painters was only compiled until 1971.

It really inspires me when former Royal Worcester thimble painters or their descendants, have taken the time to make contact and send me their own Royal Worcester painting history. They probably found their names on these thimble pages, when doing an internet search. Not many of them have kept examples of their own work on thimbles.

One painter remembers: "Also, a lovely lady guildler who was in her own section of the room, putting the gold lines around our finished work... Mrs Appleton (known as Mrs A)".

Thimbles are small, so when painter's name is too long the **signatures** were often shortened or only initials used. I have noticed that the earlier painted thimbles mostly have the signature close to the subject being painted – to the bottom right. The 1970- thimbles have the signature on the verso alongside a leaf or flower sprig.

I have included the first names even when not part of the signature. Most signatures only contain the initial and surname.

Royal Worcester thimbles were never signed by the artist inside the thimble.

Some signatures are always going to be difficult to decipher, but with practice one can become familiar with styles of painting and so be able to attempt to guess – e.g. Kitty Blake's signature is often illegible or 'messy'.

You may notice how many identical paintings there are, done by different artists, especially amongst the later painters. Once you have handled or looked at the painting depicted, you will soon be able to identify the later style of painting (post 1970), even tho the thimbles are not dated.

This interesting item of information has come to my attention: "In the late 1970s the demand for Royal Worcester hand-painted thimbles grew enormously. One can speculate as to the reason(s). Maybe the thought of an original thimble was alluring. Royal Worcester did not want to employ more artists for economic reasons as thimbles are time-consuming to paint freehand (at least three firings).

The foreman of the painters' division, Edward Townsend, came up with a solution. He designed a number of outline prints - six flowers, six fruit and eight birds - which were printed onto the blank thimbles. The artists did not have to create an individual painting but merely coloured in the blank design. This speeded up the process noticeably.



Some of the painters (Sue Waldron) were dismissive of this process and much preferred doing original work on larger items."

Compare the same topic (ie blue tit) amongst the most modern thimbles and you will notice that this is true: they all look alike. From observation the common themes are = fruit with apple, peach, pear and plum in that order with smaller fruits used alongside.

The birds depicted are tit, kingfisher, wren, robin, bullfinch, and a generic red bird and one with yellow colouring.

Rose and daisy of various colours dominate the flower paintings with iris, violets and forget-me-nots following.

Other English garden birds were handpainted by the earlier bird painting experts and feature swallow, chaffinch, redstart, thrush, goldfinch and even a woodpecker.

Primrose, heather, pansy, morning glory, daffodil, anemone, crocus, wattle, tulip, carnation, poppy, peach blossom and bluebell are some of the rarer flower paintings on RW thimbles, including an example of strawberry flower and the fruit.

Fruit is a more modern topic for painting.

The modern painters who painted from the 1970s onwards include:

Fiona Bakewell, Christine Cameron, Janet Collins, Claire Cox, Pat Dunkley, Sheila Dutfield, Gioran Garcia, Mary Igoe, Angela Lawson, Helene Lighthert, Mandy Munslow, Christine Parker, Sue Roberts, Dorothy Sparks, Julia Vass, Christine Wilson.

It is interesting to note that the later painters were all women - in the early days of Royal Worcester, most of the painters were men.

With the modern painters, note that there are two sizes of the RW backstamp. I have used this information to date the probable time period the painters worked in the thimble painting dept.

The Royal Worcester factory and shop at Severn Street in Worcester closed on 14th June 2009. The buildings were then demolished, for other development.

The Royal Worcester name was purchased by Portmeirion Pottery of Stoke-on-Trent.

The list of RW thimble painters includes dates that each painter is known to have painted for Royal Worcester.

I have included their life dates, where they are available, in square brackets alongside their names.

I have included as many thimble examples as possible for each artist.

The list may not be complete. To date there are **238 artists** listed who are believed to have painted thimbles for Royal Worcester (this includes paintresses' (a delightful RW early term used in the factory) maiden and married names, where they painted under both names).

So far - with help from collectors around the world - **220** have examples of their handpainted Royal Worcester thimbles. There are now only **17** thimbles to find by these RW painters, listed below (* known to have painted RW thimbles).

Nineteenth century and unsigned Royal Worcester thimbles

It is rare to find in the early Royal Worcester thimbles that the apex has been gilded - usually a sign that if it is gilded, the thimble is not an early Royal Worcester

It seems a logical order to show you some of these lovely works - to group them into broad topics.

A range of handpainted birds













A range of handpainted flowers

the holly one (at the end) has a robin on the verso – there is a band of roses too – a first?







There is a small range of handpainted insects



A range of jewelled thimbles

The geometric painting is often described as "jewelled", with droplets or enamelled paint. The green ones at the end are rarer than the other coloured "jewels": as is the bi-coloured one!

In the photos below a few thimbles appear to have a gold painted apex. There is only a gilded line at the apex. Those that appear to have a gold painted apex, it is just a poor photo or a trick of the light. No gold painted apex.







Fruit



By observation from compiling the above gallery of early handpainted Royal Worcester thimbles, it is apparent that fruit as a subject belongs to the 20th century - and that the jewelled thimbles belong to the 19th C?
