# British registered design numbers (RD) thimbles

I hadn't planned to field a topic where there is a published book on the subject. This topic extends the book *British registered design thimbles* by Norma Spicer and Diane Pelham Burn in 2003. This has been brought about a few thimble designs, which they had not previously been recorded.

The 19<sup>th</sup> century (from 1850) was the most innovative era in thimble design. To protect these new designs the maker could register his new design. This registered number granted was then stamped on the band.

I thought I had sorted out the difference between a registered design on thimbles and a patented design.

The latter protects the new use or type of thimble being patented.

Charles Horner used both of these ways of protecting his Dorcas thimbles. Patent No. 8954 of 1884, patented his improved thimble, which was to produce a steel-cored sterling silver thimble. These thimbles were marked PAT. or PATENT. Once he began to register new designs for his Dorcas and sterling silver thimbles, the  $R^D$  No. would be added as well.

I have lettered the date in blue when the registered number is included on the band. This shows the period when they were lettered.

I have included an unknown registration number at the end, in the hope that someone knows it.

The topic concludes with thimble holders with registered design numbers.

Many of these thimbles feature throughout the topics.

#### **THIMBLES**

Tho some of the photos don't show the RD No they all are part of the registered design. Some may have been made later or I don't have a view of the R<sup>D</sup> No. I have included as many relevant photos, to try and show their rarity – or not.






